

ORDINANCE NO. 5

AN ACT REGULATING THE LICENSING OF DOGS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF CARLTON, CARLTON COUNTY, MINNESOTA, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Village Council of the Village of Carlton do ordain as follows:

- Sec. 1 No person or persons, firm, company or corporation shall own or keep any dog within the corporate limits of the Village of Carlton, Carlton County, Minnesota, without having a license therefor as herein provided.
- Sec. 2 Any person, persons, firm, company or corporation desiring to own or keep any dog within the corporate limits of said Village, shall procure a license therefore as follows: Said person shall first pay to the Village Treasurer of said Village the full amount of the license fee as hereinafter fixed for one full year, and shall take the Village Treasurer's receipt for the same, said applicant shall then file said receipt with the said Village Recorder, together with an application to said Council for said license, said Council may then authorize said Village Recorder to make out and deliver to said applicant such license for the full term of one year, from the 1st Tuesday in July.
- Sec. 3 Upon being authorized by said Council, said Village Recorder shall make out and deliver to said applicant said license, which licenses shall be signed by said Recorder and attested by the corporate seal of said Village, and numbered in its regular order. Said Recorder shall also at the same time deliver to said applicant a metal tag which tag shall have stamped thereon the word "CARLTON" and the number of said license. Said tag shall be attached to said dog in some conspicuous manner.
- Sec. 4 The finding of any dog within the corporate limits of said Village without such tag attached to it shall be prima facie evidence that no license has been issued to the owner or keeper of said dog.
- Sec. 5 It shall be the duty of the Village Marshall of said Village to notify the owner of all dogs found within the corporate limits of said Village without tags, as therein provided, and order said owner or keeper to immediately procure a license for the said dog, according to the conditions of this ordinance, and if said owner or keeper shall neglect or refuse to procure said license within the space of five days after being so ordered or shall neglect or refuse to attach said tag to said dog within said time, said Marshall shall immediately kill or otherwise dispose of said dog, and in no instance shall it be necessary for said Marshall to notify said owner or keeper more than once.
- Sec. 6 Any person or persons the owner or keeper of any dog within the corporate limits of said Village who shall neglect or refuse to take out a license for said dog within five days after being notified by said Marshall as above provided, or who shall neglect or refuse to attach said tag within five days shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace in and for said Village, shall be fined in the sum of not less than One Dollar nor more than Twenty five dollars, and costs of suit and in default of payment of said fine and costs, the person so convicted shall be committed to the Watch house of Jail of said Village or County Jail of said County until such fine and costs are fully paid, but not to exceed ninety days.

Sec. 7 The following amounts are hereby fixed as such license fee.
For each and every Male dog the sum of ONE DOLLAR per year
payable yearly in advance.
For each and every Female Dog the sum of TWO DOLLARS, per
year payable yearly in advance.
All parts of years preceeding the next First Tuesday in July
shall be deemed a year and the full license fee as above fixed
shall be paid for any such part of a year.

Sec. 8 The Village Recorder of saidVillage shall keep a record of all
licenses issued pursuant to this ordinance, in a book kept for
that purpose, and all license fees collected pursuant to this
ordinance shall be credited to and become a part ofthe general
fund of the Village.

Sec. 9 Old ordinance number Ten and Fifteen entitled "AN Ordinance
relating to Dog Licenses" are hereby repealed.

Sec. 10 This act shall be in force from and after its passage and
publication.
