

ORDINANCE NO 9 (OLD)

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO CONVICT LABOR, VILLAGE OF CARLTON, MINNESOTA

The Village Council of the Village of Carlton (Northern Pacific Junction) do ordain as follows:

- Sec. 1 Any male persons convicted and fined in a Justice Court of the Village of Northern Pacific Junction, who shall fail to pay such fine, and costs, may be sentenced to hard labor on the Streets or Public Works of the Village, for such time as shall be sufficient at the rate of One Dollar per day to pay such fine and costs.
- Sec. 2 Whenever any person is sentenced to labor as aforesaid, the Village Marshall shall carry such sentence into effect, and for this purpose he may place such person during the daytime in the charge of the Street Commissioner or some person so designated by him, and if such person shall refuse to work as directed by the Street Commissioner or such person so designated, the Village Marshall or his Deputy or the Jailor of Carlton County, shall feed such person on bread and water only, during the time he shall so refuse to work and if any person shall escape and be taken he shall forfeit the time he may have worked and shall again work out his full sentence. Provided that any convicted person may at any time pay his fine and costs, deducting therefrom the amount earned by him at labor as therein provided, and be thereafter discharged.
- Sec. 3 This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
