

ORDINANCE NUMBER 133

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 131 ENTITLED " AN ORDINANCE LICENSING AND REGULATING THE SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR, REPEALING INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION".

The City Council of the City of Carlton does hereby Ordain as follows:

Ordinance Number 131-Section 2. License Required- is hereby emended as follows.

Section 2. License Required.

Subdivision 1. General Requirement. No person except a wholesaler or manufacturer to the extent authorized under state license, shall directly or indirectly deal in, sell, or keep for sale in the city any intoxicating liquor without a license to do so as provided in the ordinance. Liquor Licenses shall be of three kinds: "On Sale" , "On Sale Wine" and "Off Sale". The City shall make available for issuance 4 "On-Sale" licenses, 2 "On-Sale Wine" licenses and 4 "Off-Sale" licenses. An eligible exclusive liquor store may be issued both an "On Sale" and an "Off Sale" license. "On Sale" licenses shall be issued only to hotels, clubs, restaurants, and exclusive liquor stores and shall permit "On Sale" of liquor only. "On Sale" Wine shall be issued only to restaurants meeting the qualifications of Minnesota Statutes, Section 340.11, Subdivision 20 and shall permit only the sale of wine not exceeding 14 percent alcohol by volume, for consumption on the licensed premises only, in conjunction with the sale of food. "Off-Sale" licenses shall be issued only to drug stores and exclusive liquor stores and shall permit "Off Sales" of liquor only.

This ordinance becomes effective upon its passage and publication, according to law.
