

ORDINANCE NO. 70

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 53 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF CARLTON, AND IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF".

The Village Council of the Village of Carlton do hereby ordain as follows:

Sec. I Ordinance No. 53 entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF CARLTON, AND IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF", is hereby amended by striking therefrom the last paragraph of Section 3, which is under sub-heading No. 14 thereof, and inserting in lieu thereof the following;

See #53 X

"No person shall park a commercial vehicle of more than ONE TON capacity upon any of the following streets in said Village, to-wit: Second, Third and Chestnut Streets; provided, however, that this shall not prohibit the parking of such vehicles for not more than a period of thirty (30) minutes along any such street for the purpose of having access to any property abutting thereon when such access cannot conveniently be secured from an alley or other side street. No vehicle shall be parked on any street for the purpose of displaying it for sale and no vehicle shall in any case be parked upon any street in any one place for a longer consecutive period than TWELVE (12) HOURS: PROVIDED THAT WHERE SUCH PARKING OCCURS ON A STATE TRUNK HIGHWAY AND AFTER SIGNS HAVE BEEN POSTED PURSUANT THERETO. VEHICLES SHALL NOT BE PARKED IN ANY ONE PLACE FOR A LONGER CONSECUTIVE PERIOD THAN TWO (2) HOURS FROM 8 A.M. to 6 P.M. ON THE FOLLOWING STREETS, TO-WIT: Chestnut Street between First and Third Streets and on Third Street between North and School Streets.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication according to law.
