

ORDINANCE NO. 25

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PROSTITUTES AND DISORDERLY PERSONS FROM FRE-
QUENTING SALOONS

The Village Council of the Village of Carlton do ordain as follows:

- Sec. 1 It shall be unlawful for any common prostitute or disorderly person to visit or frequent any saloon or place where intoxicating liquors are sold within said Village or to visit or frequent any room in the same or an adjoining building directly or indirectly under the control of said saloon, and it shall be unlawful for any saloon keeper or person in charge of any saloon to allow any prostitute or disorderly person to frequent his place of business, or to allow the place for which he is licensed or any room in the same or an adjoining building directly or indirectly under his control to be used as a resort for prostitutes or other disorderly persons.
- Sec. 2 Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment in the County Jail for not to exceed ninety days or by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars with cost of prosecution.
- Sec. 3 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
