

ORDINANCE NO. 20

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF CARLTON GRANTING TO THE SAUNTRY-CAIN COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE RIGHT TO OPERATE AND MAINTAIN A TELEPHONE LINE OVER, UPON, ALONG AND UNDER THE STREETS AND OTHER PUBLIC WAYS OF THE VILLAGE OF CARLTON, MINNESOTA

The Village Council of the Village of Carlton, Minnesota do ordain as follows:

- Sec. 1            There is hereby granted to the Sauntry-Cain Company its successors and assigns the right, privilege and authority to construct, operate and maintain a telephone line or lines, with all necessary and convenient poles, wires and other appurtenances for the transaction of its business, over, along upon and under the streets and other public ways of the Village of Carlton, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter provided.
- Sec. 2            All poles shall be erected under the direction and supervision of the Committee on Streets and Alleys, and all streets or sidewalks that may be disturbed or damaged in the construction of the said lines shall be promptly replaced and repaired by the said Sauntry-Cain Company its successors or assigns, at its own expense, and to the satisfaction of said Committee on Streets and Alleys.
- Sec. 3            The said Sauntry-Cain Company, its successors or assigns, shall assume and pay all damages for personal or other injuries that may occur, resulting from or growing out of the negligence or want of care on the part of the said Sauntry-Cain Company, its successors or assigns in the construction of any portion of said telephone line as herein provided for or in the repair or maintenance of the same, and shall keep harmless and indemnified the Village of Carlton from any liability or expense which may be placed upon it for which it may be liable on account of any injury resulting from such negligence on the part of the said Sauntry-Cain Company its successors and assigns aforesaid.
- Sec. 4            This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication and its acceptance in writing by said Sauntry-Cain Company within thirty days after its passage.
