

ORDINANCE NO. 19

AN ORDINANCE TO PREVENT NOISE, DISTURBANCE AND DISORDERLY ASSEMBLAGES IN THE VILLAGE OF CARLTON, CARLTON COUNTY, MINNESOTA, TO PREVENT ANY DISORDERLY CONDUCT IN PUBLIC PLACES THEREIN AND TO PREVENT CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF SIXTEEN YEARS FROM LOITERING OR BEING UPON THE STREETS OF SAID VILLAGE BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 9 P.M. AND 6 A.M. AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ARREST AND PUNISHMENT OF ANY PERSON OR PERSONS VIOLATING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE.

The Village Council of the Village of Carlton do ordain as follows:

- Sec 1. *CURFIEW* It shall be unlawful for any boy or girl under the age of sixteen years to be abroad the streets, alleys or public grounds of the Village of Carlton between the hours of nine o'clock p.m. and six o'clock a.m. unless accompanied by some person of lawful age having him or her in charge, or unless upon some errand by permission or direction of his or her parents, guardian or employer. He or she shall not then loiter on the way nor make any undue noise by shouting or yelling or otherwise to disturb the peace or quiet of said village.
- Sec 2. *PE-NALTY* Any boy or girl who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to arrest by any Marshall or peace officer of said Village without process. Upon such arrest he or she shall be taken and delivered into the hands of the parents, guardian or employer of such boy or girl. Upon a second or subsequent offense such offender shall be taken by the person making the arrest before a Justice of the Peace for said Village and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding ten dollars or by imprisonment in the Village or County Jail for not exceeding ten days.
- Sec 3. It shall be the duty of the Marshall of said Village to have the hour of nine p.m. designed by the ringing of the Village fire bell nine slow taps consecutively.
- Sec 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
