



Carlton is nestled two hours north of the Twin Cities and twenty minutes south of Duluth, along Interstate 35. There is a rich history in Carlton, built upon the Northern Pacific Railroad when, in 1870, a stretch of tracks was completed to connect Duluth to St. Paul. The settlement of Northern Pacific Junction became incorporated by the State of Minnesota as "Carlton" in 1881.

Today, the thriving community of Carlton is the junction of the Willard Munger and Alex Laveau State Trails and the St. Louis River Trail. The beautiful natural environment is on display for all to enjoy while participating in the many active transportation and recreation opportunities the area has to offer.



The City boasts many amenities: Jay Cooke State Park, a bike shop with rentals, fishing and kayaking on Thomson Reservoir, a professional disc golf course, Blackbear Casino and 18 hole golf course, eateries, a grocery store, a bed and breakfast, gas stations, financial institutions, a post office, an art gallery, and so much more!
