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10.02 Fire Department Report

Fire Chief Johnson updated the Council on the Wildland Fire Truck. Spec's will be sent out for bids starting September 14, 2016 and the Fire Officers would like to have the bid opening at 5:30pm on October 11. 2016.

Mayor and City Council,

We have currently responded to 435 emergency calls as of 8/30/2016, this is ahead of our pace from 2015. We continue to get our new EMT's through the department's orientation process. We were awarded two more grants in August from MN Energies (\$1,000) and the MN DNR (\$4,000 - 50/50 local match). These funding sources will be added to the \$2,000 from Enbridge to buy all the firefighters on the department new helmets. We are grateful that these grants are available to services like ours. Our department held several trainings in August including a joint search and rescue exercise with Esko and Wrenshall in Jay Cooke State Park and a high angle technical rescue evolution also in Jay Cooke utilizing new rope gear that was purchased by the Carlton Fireman's Relief Association. Members have been busy planning for our annual Steak Fry Event which will be held September 10th at 5 pm. We completed building the spec for our wildland / utility truck. We plan to have solicitation for bids go out in the coming weeks with a bid opening in early October. Asst. Chief Wolf used our ladder truck in conjunction with Esko's ladder truck to hoist a flag over I-35 during a funeral escort traveling through Carlton for two firefighters that were killed in an accident in Blaine, MN. Our members also facilitated a CPR class for teachers at the Carlton High School in preparation for the start of the school year. We hope you all enjoy what we have left of summer and hope to see you at Steak Fry. Thank you for your continued support!
